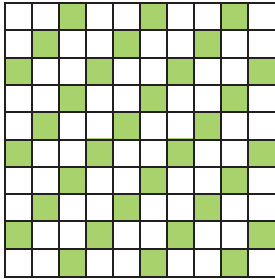
1. Lynne

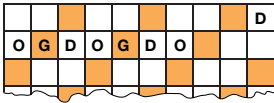

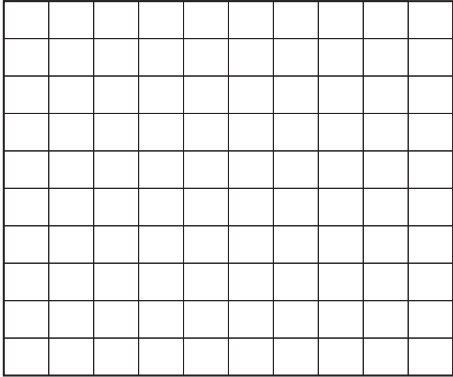
Ten-by-Ten Name Grid
