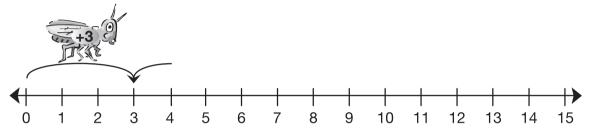
Professor Peabody's Constant Hoppers
