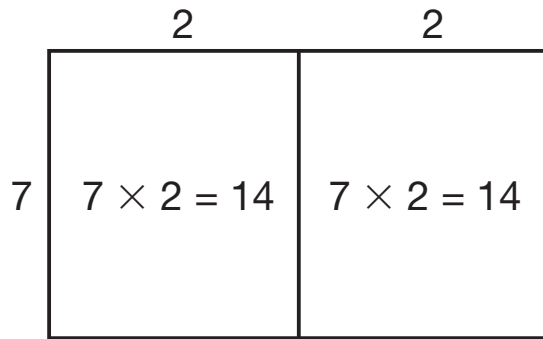


**0 More Break-Apart Products**

Example:  $7 \times 4$



$$\begin{aligned}7 \times 4 &= (7 \times 2) + (7 \times 2) \\7 \times 4 &= 14 + 14 \\7 \times 4 &= 28\end{aligned}$$
